



The snow started to cover the clearing they had prepared for the runway. Mom was concerned that dad would not be able to see where to land when he returned, so we chopped down some small, very scruffy pine trees with an axe. We dragged them across the ice to plant them in a row of

There was no electricity or modern conveniences, so Mom showed us how to make decorations. We practiced our hand at creating threaded popcorn garlands and decorative paper ornaments.

What an exciting adventure for us, a favorite childhood Christmas.

Dad's plane buzzed overhead and he circled tipping the wings to wave at all his girls. The picture of us there together is etched in my mind and has left me with a warm feeling for Christmas. We celebrated Christ's birth and enjoyed our family.

We knew that our gift that year was being together and there would be no presents for us. There was only so much room in the plane and we were far from home. I don't recall any feelings of disappointment. It was exciting and we were filled with joy.

Our older brother Len (Kilbreath), and his young family joined us and we warmed ourselves in the cabin, enjoying each other's company. The cabin was lit with kerosene lanterns, candles and for us younger ones, flashlights. We played in the snow and on the skidoo our brother had ridden out to the lake on. We didn't us. know it, but he had brought our gifts, and in the morning we were surprised to find the tree loaded with all our favorite things! Len had transported the gifts on a sled pulled by his snowmobile.

Dad was the best gift giver, and he always got us what we wanted, but had a way of convincing us that it wouldn't be our favoured item. If memory serves correctly, this was the year he teased

Cathie that the tape recorder she wanted so desperately was not available, and just how badly he felt that they couldn't get it. I remember the pleasure he had when she opened it and was overcome with joy! I received my first guitar. Mom and Dad loved to surprise us, bless us, and make the best time out of the simplest of things. How much more our heavenly Father loves us. The Word says in Psalm 84:11 For the LORD God is a sun and shield: the LORD will give grace and glory: no good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly. 120 LORD of hosts, blessed is the man that trusteth in thee. As we approach this precious time of year in which we celebrate the birth of Our Saviour, it is important to acknowledge, at the same time, the completion of the story that began in Bethlehem: Jesus' glorious conquering of death itself in the resurrection. This incredible event was proclaimed by the early believers as proof that He was indeed the Son of God. As Paul writes in Romans 1:3. God sent "His Son, who was born of a descendant of David according to the flesh, who was declared the Son of God with power by the resurrection from the dead."

In my first two columns, I have looked at the New Testament writings as historical documents to determine the foundational beliefs of the early church that unified the various congregations spread across the Roman Empire. We saw last time how the early believers were unified in their belief that Jesus of Nazareth died on the cross for their sins but, even more foundational to their faith. was the belief that He rose from the dead. The belief in this supernatural event is what separated believers from unbelievers. I'd like to look at this belief from a historian's point of view. There are four elements that I look for in assessing historical credibility in a story.

The first element is primary documentation: the closer to the actual event that an account was written or recorded, the more likely its accuracy. Accounts given by old timers fifty years after an event are less credible than newspaper accounts written shortly after. The earliest account of the resurrection is probably in 1 Corinthians 15:3-8. This was the expression of the gospel that Paul himself received at the time of his conversion, three years after the death of Jesus. "For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to

the Scriptures."

The second element we look for in determining historical accuracy is multiple attestations. The more eyewitnesses there are the better. Of significant importance is that the first people to see the risen Jesus were women. In the society of the day, women had a low status and were considered unqualified to act as legal witnesses. If anyone was making up a story, they would certainly avoid using women as witnesses. Paul, in 1 Corinthians, goes on to say, "that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. After that He appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom remain until now, but some have fallen asleep; then He appeared to James, then to all the apostles; and last of all, as to one untimely born. He appeared to me also."

Another benchmark of historical accuracy is dissimilarity. The less the story fits the preconceived expectations, the more likely it is to be true. It is an established fact that, although the Jewish people believed in resurrection, they thought it would come to everyone on the final day. Jesus' resurrection, seen by Christians as the "first fruits" of the final resurrection, did not line up with their beliefs.

The final proof of historical accuracy is effect of the story: the stronger people's commitment to the story the more likely it is true. The transformation of the disciples and early believers and their commitment to the belief in Jesus' resurrection, even to the point of suffering and death, made it extremely unlikely that they did not accept the resurrection as fact.

The historical evidence for the resurrection of Jesus is strong. Few would question the resurrection appearance accounts and we are left with the surprising conclusion: Jesus of Nazareth was raised from the dead, proving to all that He was indeed the Son of God.

This year, we added an extra night on Friday to give more people the opportunity to take in the event. We also added special music between


the marketplace and the live play so you can be entertained while you wait for the next production to begin.







Abraham was told to go to "a country he did not yet know, to do a ministry" that was, as yet unrevealed to him. He went, not knowing, but believing in the God whom he had seen do all that He promised.

God bless the saints that agreed to house me and provide for me in my first few months in that great land!

Early on in my Christian experience I'd learned some of the principles of living by faith. This took place at The Faith Mission Bible College in Edinburgh, Scotland. They taught us to make our (practical) needs known to God. They further assured us that the Lord would reveal to those of His children who should be the carriers of His provision in our lives. Whereas this is very true in essence, sometimes we as God's children don't promptly respond to His nudging, especially when it comes to our pocket books. (I speak as a Scot!) Etched in my memory is the experience of seeing my first miracle in the area of provision. While attending Bible College in the winter of 1983, the need arose for me to have new boots.

Someone had spoken a message on the subject of prayer, and more specifically, the need to be specific! So, I prayed. God gave me a figure to believe Him for (40 Pounds) then I waited for Him to prompt a believing saint to send me the required amount. After this, I would go and buy myself my choice of leather, winter boots. Unforgettable is the day

when a room-mate called me to speak with her in private one morning not long after. She had received winter boots in a parcel by mail and they were the wrong size. Did they fit me? Astounded, I tried them on. Did I like them? To my surprise they both fit and looked perfect. I was somewhat puzzled but realized that His ways were higher than mine (Isaiah 55). Imagine my confusion when a few days later I was summoned to the College office to be told by the secretary that a sum of money had been donated to me by an anonymous donor. The sum was 50 pounds. Confused, I questioned why a complete stranger would send money to me out of the 32 (or so) student body? Answer: God had told them to! They prayed regularly for all of the students by name. They had indeed, sent donations to a few others along with myself. This was a first for me. After a time of thanksgiving and struggling to accept this gift, I realized I had received DOUBLE what I had asked for! John 10:10 says:"I am come that they might have life in abundance".

Once I grasped the immensity of His love for me in answering my specific prayer, I was amazed.

Looking back over 27 years, this story has repeated itself over and over, and not only in the area of practical provision. Missionary calling, relationships, and growing in the life of faith are a few of the ways in which He has proved Himself faithful to His title of Jehovah Jirah. ('The Lord Provides')

Like in Abraham's journey, God has visited to assure me of His presence and approval. So many other voices are out there shouting at our self-image, inducing guilt trips and the like. These are traps of satan. Don't be fooled by them. God's promises are the surest you will ever receive. He is a 'man of His word".

When God said in Genesis 12:7, "I WILL GIVE THIS LAND TO YOUR DESCENDANTS", He had no sooner spoken, and Abraham's swift response was to set up an altar of dedication and to worship his God. What if we were to react in the same manner? When we have a challenge that seems impossible, what if instead of doubting or listening to the questioning naysayers, we were to bow down with our faces to the ground in humble adoration?

Soon we will be again singing the refrain: 'O COME LET US ADORE HIM". Let us really do it as our chosen lifestyle.

Abraham was called, convinced and consecrated. "Lord, give me a heart like his!" Obedience was a hallmark of this faith-hero. Instant obedience. "Lord, help me react in swift obedience and regular consecration as you lead me in this life of faith".

We need not be fearful or unsure of this style of living, "by faith". As God's own children we now live "By the faith OF THE SON OF GOD. His faith + His life + His sacrifice = my destiny as a child of the King.

Life is an adventure when lived by this principle. My personal perspective in this season has been a fantastic opportunity to see His Kingdom people this side of the Atlantic in a very green and pleasant land. It has been faith-stretching, and a time of growing ever closer to the Author and Finisher of our faith, as I keep my eyes focused on Him, and RUN!

Through the Lord Jesus, God made it possible for us to be born again, from the inside out-to a new life.




